We're excited for another year of learning at Byron Kibler Elementary! As a staff we are focused on building a solid foundation in academics and social-emotional skills for our students.

We continue to make reading, writing, and math

our core academic focus. We are always reflecting on how to adjust to meet our students' needs. Check out what we're working on for the 2017-18 school year:

- ★ We have revamped our building schedule to allot 30 minutes of strategic reading time for each grade level. During this time all of our available support staff will be meeting with small groups to better support students' needs and goals.
- ★ Kibler is also the proud recipient of the "Best Starts for Kids" King County Grant. We were awarded this grant to collaborate with the Sound Discipline organization to expand our restorative practices for all students.
- ★ We have new science curriculum for our 3rd through 5th graders.

Collaboration is at the heart of our work. Each Friday we meet in teams to discuss how to support our students. This year we are using a new electronic tool to share student goals. This will ensure that students have encouragement and teaching toward their individual goal with every staff member they work with.

We kicked off the school year with our third annual "Bear Week" to revisit our school-wide expectations for success. At our first assembly our own Kibler parent, Carol Decker, shared about setting goals and working hard toward them. We will celebrate individual student successes in goal setting in the classroom, lunchroom, and at all school assemblies.

LEARNING SPACES AND FEATURES

Byron Kibler Elementary was built in 1953; construction projects expanded the school in 1956, 1989, and 1993. We have 19 classrooms, Resource Room, Reading Room, English Language Learners room, Music Room, Library, and multi-purpose room.

- ★ Kibler has four mobile laptop carts for students to use technology as a tool in their learning. Fifth grade classrooms have dedicated Chromebook carts and all K-5 classrooms have Interactive Activeboards to expand learning beyond the classroom walls.
- ★ Students socialize at recess on a large playground including several play structures, a basketball court, wall ball courts, four square courts, tetherball courts, and sitting areas shaded by large trees.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Kibler's dedicated teaching staff focuses on meeting individual student needs by looking at student data, meeting with individuals regularly, and providing a rich menu of supports. Kibler Elementary has many additional programs to meet students' needs: Title 1 and LAP Reading Intervention Grants, Federal Special Education Funding, Speech and Language Program, Physical Education, Music Education, Social-Emotional Education, ELL (English Language Learning), and a District-wide Highly Capable program.




TEST SCORE INFORMATION

Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBAC) have been taken for two years in Washington state. Measurements of Student progress is a Washington state specific assessment. Percentage of students achieving proficiency at Byron Kibler Elementary School is compared to Washington State and Enumclaw School District cohorts in the chart below. 
