Welcome back to another year of learning at Kibler Elementary, the school with heart! Our 53 staff members are dedicated to building relationships with our 440 students to ensure their academic and social-emotional growth.

In our classrooms you will see students engaged in meaningful learning. During our reading block students are taught how to make intentional book choices so their practice time is motivating and productive. Likewise during writing, students are learning author's craft in writing pieces of their choice in narrative, expository, and opinion genres. Thinking strategies are taught and practiced that span all of our subject areas. Mathematics is a complex subject that comes alive with manipulatives and group problem solving. Knowing that student's social-emotional skills are directly linked to their learning, this year we held a special "Bear Week" to roll out school-wide expectations centered around our three student values: Show Respect, Make Good Decisions, and Solve Problems.

In our collaborative teaching teams, staff work together to meet individual student's needs and engage in professional learning. We continue to be grateful and utilize early release Fridays to do this important work. As a school we are studying brain research and its implications for social-emotional skills, self-regulation and learning.

We value our partnership with families and our larger community. Our PTA supports student projects at each grade level; as well as evening events for the whole family. You won't want to miss this year's movie or bingo nights! Our holiday reading night tradition will continue as well, with special guest readers, a book exchange, and delicious treats.

We know rigorous academic learning, social-emotional support, collaborating together, and partnering with our community will continue to make Kibler a place where kids bloom and flourish.

LEARNING SPACES AND FEATURES

Byron Kibler Elementary was built in 1953; construction projects expanded the school in 1956, 1989, and 1993. We have nineteen general education classrooms, a resource room, a Title I reading room, a English Language Learners room, a music education room, a library, and a multi-purpose room.

★Kibler has four mobile laptop carts for students to use technology as a tool in their learning. This year all three fifth grade classrooms have their own Chromebook cart, allowing students daily access to online learning experiences. All K-5 classrooms have Interactive Activeboards to expand learning beyond the classroom walls.

★Students socialize at recess on a large playground including several play structures, a basketball court, wall ball courts, four square courts, tetherball courts, and sitting areas shaded by large trees.

★Kibler Elementary hosts PTA family events, school-wide learning nights, and Enumclaw Parks and Recreation activities, such as Ukulele lessons.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Kibler's dedicated teaching staff focuses on meeting individual student needs by looking at student data, meeting with individuals regularly, and providing a rich menu of supports. Kibler Elementary has many additional programs to meet students' needs: Title 1 and LAP Reading Intervention Grants, Federal Special Education Funding, Speech and Language Program, Physical Education, Music Education, Social-Emotional Education, and ELL (English Language Learning). Our supportive paraeducators assist classroom teachers daily to meet individual student needs in a variety of settings.

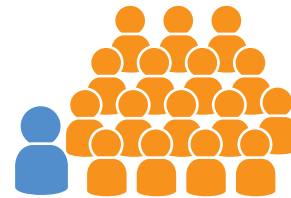
