PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

There are exciting opportunities for students to participate in. We are in our 5th year developing and expanding the STEM program. We offer a Design class in the 7th grade as well as Robotics and Advanced "Project Lead The Way" courses in the 8th grade. The advanced course is a yearlong elective that expands on the concepts as 7th graders in the Design class. Another exciting program is the Alpha or leadership class. This class gives students an opportunity to participate in school-wide leadership as well as community service at the school, community, and global levels. Our students have been the drivers behind several fund raisers for schools in impoverished countries as well as making their mark here at home. Our gifted and talented students also receive services through the District-wide Highly Capable program.

LEARNING SPACES AND FEATURES

We are a Level 3 Green School moving towards Level 4. This has been a multi-year process involving students in every grade. They have done some very impressive work in taking a stand on being environmentally conscious. EMS was built in 1983 with additions in 1990 and 1991. There are 28 classrooms.


