Welcome to Sunrise Elementary, home of the Eagles. Sunrise is home to over 420 students and 50 staff members, serving students from Kindergarten through 5th grade and their families. Our mission is to ensure all students are achieving at high levels.

This year, we've continued our focus on creating a positive learning environment at Sunrise. By modeling and intentional teaching of our expectations for behavior, students are able to gain a clear understanding of how to be safe, respectful, and responsible each day at school. These behaviors translate to students being able to thrive in their learning.

One way we ensure all students are achieving at high levels is through our strategic intervention program. Strategic intervention is a 30 minute block of time each Monday-Thursday where every classroom is flooded with extra teacher and para-educator support for an additional level of tier-2 instruction. With consistent planning, professional development, and intentional implementation, we are confident that our students will make great strides in their academic progress.

Another important way we ensure all students are achieving at high levels is through our professional learning communities. Each week, our teachers meet in collaborative teams to focus on the needs of individual students and plan upcoming interventions, enrichments, and assessments to more effectively meet student needs.

At Sunrise, we follow a set of shared values about our children, our climate, and our work. These values guide our beliefs about teaching and learning. We believe that all children can learn and deserve a safe, satisfying, and successful school experience. We believe that high expectations for student achievement combined with intentional support and intervention will result in academic proficiency and growth. We believe in building partnerships between school, home, and community. Through these shared beliefs, students at Sunrise Elementary experience an education that is profound and lasting.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

At Sunrise Elementary, students are provided with several opportunities to enhance their learning experience. At the fourth and fifth grade levels, students have an opportunity to be part of our student leadership program. These students work in teams to learn valuable leadership lessons throughout the year, organize leadership team volunteer projects, and help plan for schoolwide events such as spirit days and community service projects. Students are also supported through an after school tutoring program as well as other extra-curricular opportunities. Additionally, our fifth grade students have the privilege of taking part in our Dancing Classrooms program each winter.

LEARNING SPACES AND FEATURES

Sunrise Elementary was built in 1992 and is in its original state. The building consists of 23 classrooms, a gymnasium/multipurpose room with a stage and adjacent kitchen. There is also a library, music room, and administrative area.

Sunrise is committed to incorporating technology as a way to engage students in a blended learning model. We currently have four laptop/Chromebook carts for classroom and media instructional use. Our fifth grade classrooms are 1:1 with a Chromebook for each student.

Additionally, each of our Kindergarten and first grade classrooms each have sets of 5-6 Chromebooks for instructional use. Each classroom is equipped with a Promethean board, projector, and document camera to enhance student learning.

Finally, the Sunrise Outdoor Learning Area is an outdoor educational space developed over the past five years through various grants and volunteer work. Recently, we've added signage to the area, constructed a performance stage and bench seating, and planted over fifty native trees and shrubs. We're excited about the learning that will take place in this area for years to come.

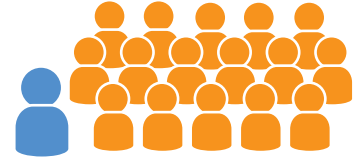

There are 26 certificated teachers on staff rendering a teacher to student ratio of 1:16. Seventy-three percent have a Master's Degree or higher.



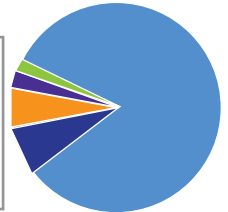

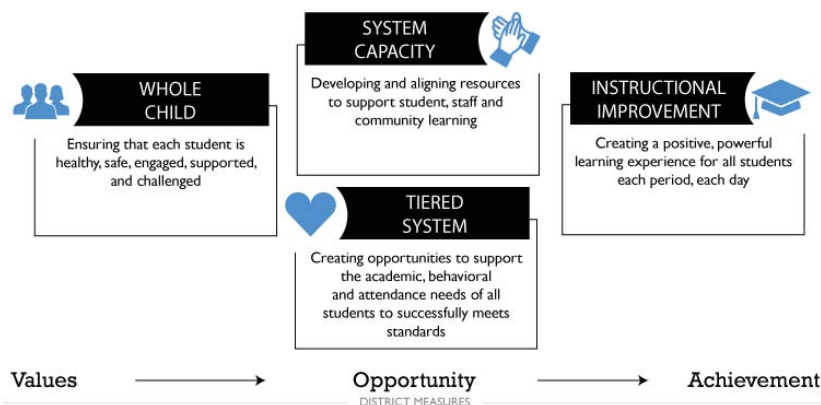
